The summer exhibition at the Garden Museum is *The Highgrove Florilegium*: watercolours by over 70 of the leading botanical artists from around the world who have painted plants and trees grown in the garden of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall. The watercolours are being published in a limited edition book by Addison Publications with all royalties going to the Prince's Charities Foundation.

The Garden Museum is the first British venue for the exhibition of these works, which are loaned with the kind permission of HRH The Prince of Wales.

Distinguished botanists worked with the Head Gardener at Highgrove, to ensure that this great garden is represented in all its aspects by an appropriate selection of material, including plants that are useful or commonplace, rare and in decline, or just beautiful.
